<p>Total P.E. grant allocation for 2015-16: £8000</p> <p>Following a successful year in 2014/15, as always we remain committed to using the school sports premium where it would be most beneficial. We have used it to help staff continue their professional development, develop our provision of OAA, continue links with a greater number of schools (Lancaster and Heysham School Sports Network), provide a range of different extra-curricular activities and provide children with an awareness of inclusive sports.</p> <p>We have also purchased a range of equipment to help with the provision of school sports.</p>	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Continue to increase participation rates in activities such as dance, games, gymnastics, outdoor learning, cricket and athletics 2. Keep links with Lancaster Bulldogs, continuing to provide children with an understanding of inclusive sports. 3. Following data collected from the children in Summer term 2015 invest in new exciting extra- curricular activities for the children. 4. Continue partnership with other schools through Lancaster schools network and the Lancs and Heysham SSN, we will continue to improve provision of competitive sports for children in a range of activities. 5. Sustain links with wider curriculum, particularly social, spiritual, moral and cultural skills. 6. Staff will use their new bespoke dance units during the year following sessions delivered by Ludus. 7. Maintain the provision of OAA (outdoor and adventurous activities) 8. Whole school focus on rounders and improving ball skills.

Children will be provided with a range of alternative sporting events.	School council surveyed children at the beginning of the year to see what clubs they would like to see on offer. Next year this responsibility will be given to our Healthy School committee as part of their responsibilities. One of the most popular ideas was Self Defence; as a result we used the budget to pay for various year groups to have the opportunity to experience this activity.

New OAA equipment has been purchased and a further investment will be made in the forest schools area next year; this will help OAA to remain sustainable for teachers in years to come. Teachers have used the resources throughout the year to help with their delivery of OAA e.g. Key Stage 1 in their Rainforest/Dinosaurs topics. Teachers will now take over the running of an OAA club next year.

Continue to provide the children with incentives to join clubs. A raffle was held during the final week of the term for all the children that have participated in clubs or represented the school in a sporting event. Participation numbers in extra-curricular sporting activities have been good this year. The school was awarded the Sainsbury's Gold Award in September which was partly due to high participation rates of children.
