<p>Total P.E. grant allocation for 2019/20: £18,460</p> <p>Following another successful year in 2018/19, as always we have remained committed to using the school sports premium where it would be most beneficial. However due to the impact of Covid 19 some of the spending which had been forecast for this year has been unfortunately delayed/ put on hold. Prior to the lockdown we used the money to renew our commitment to the School Sports Network and our affiliation with the Chance To Shine cricket program. We also used it to carry out building works to improve our outdoor area and employ expert coaches. This has been a focus for the academic year, we began by buying a range of equipment for the general provision of P.E. in curriculum time. We also purchased equipment for both KS1 and KS2 playgrounds. We then further developed the Reception OAA area and enhanced the Reception site. We have employed a grounds consultant to develop the forest school area and created a new climbing frame/ shelter and mound. They also cleared the space making it larger. Other areas around the school field have also been refurbished including the snake seating and willow area for outdoor learning. Following recent events we have also invested some money in purchasing equipment for EYFS/ lower KS1 which will help us to teach the outdoor/ creative curriculum in September.
