SCHOOL DEVELOPMENTS: CLASS DOJO

In the new year, we will ensure that we better utilise the Class Dojo online platform that we currently have in school. Class Dojo enables effective communication between school and home. Starting from January, we will ensure consistent use of Class Dojo across classes and regular updates for each class. We will use the online rewards system on Class Dojo to reinforce positive behaviour choices, aligning with the personal qualities highlighted in our termly reports. This will enable parents to know when and why positive behaviour, over and above expectations, is recognised. We currently have permissions in place for your child to be featured on Class Dojo. However, if you wish to add or change your permission, please contact the school office. In January, I will inform you about the specific uses and expectations of Class Dojo, aiming to establish a clear understanding of the school and home expectations.
