SCHOOL DEVELOPMENT: Living Streets

I am writing to you again to address the ongoing traffic issues we face during pick-up and drop-off times. The safety of our children remains our top priority, and I want to bring attention to a new initiative that our whole school will be launching after Easter - the Living Streets Initiative. This initiative aims to encourage as many of us as possible to walk to school, not only for the benefit of our health but also to help reduce traffic congestion. The Living Streets Initiative will span over a year, and each day, children will be asked to record how they travel to school using our 'Travel Tracker'. The objective is to encourage more people to consider walking, scooting, or riding bikes to school, even if it is only on an occasional basis. We will be tracking the data, and over time, I hope that we will see a decrease in the number of cars on the road. I want to acknowledge that this initiative does not solve the traffic issue we are facing, but I believe it is a step forward in making things better.
